1 Aeromad by Alexis Rochas,* a temporary inflatable structure at **Pier 40** marks the gateway and Information Hub for the San Francisco World's Fair of 2007.

1:45 PM Teacher with a Bus departs from Hub for site tour along Third Street.

2 Anchored in the bay next to Agua Vista Park is Poppa Neutrino's newest raft, *Dwight's Soup*. Constructed with found materials, *Dwight's Soup*, will carry Neutrino on his upcoming voyage from San Francisco to China.

3 LIVE from Sundance Café, Neighborhood Public Radio* will be broadcasting a daylong program of interviews with artists and community members. Tune in to 88.9 FM on Saturday for complete coverage. Also at Sundance Café, William Pope.L **presents 141 Demands in collaboration with Yerba Buena Center for the Arts.** A mural by Malik Seneferu and youth at Bayview Safe Haven **will be on display in front of Silverman Gallery.**

TWB Stop 2:45 – 4:15 PM

4A – 4D *Lyfe Nowadays*, a collaborative poem by Gamespitahz Collective displayed in **select window fronts** begins at Sundance Café and continues south along Third Street. Each window displays a stanza from a longer poem created by the youth from Bayview Safe Haven. Other venues include Hard Knox Café, Double K Café, and United Beauty Salon.

5 For the SFWF, **Daniel Cheek** documented contested sites along the Third Street Corridor. **Off Third Street** is an exhibition of his new photographs at the **Noonan Building**.

6 **Warm Water Cove Park** hosts, **One Trees**, a pair of **Natalie Jeremijenko's** cloned walnut trees, one of several sets planted around San Francisco. Jeremijenko is at Warm Water Cove Park on Saturday, recruiting participants to be involved in her new project, **Clear Skies Bike Masks**, a limited edition of bike masks that visually gauge levels of air pollution.

8 *Film Screenings at Cyclone Arts Center*

All films listed below are screening simultaneously on Saturday in the artists warehouse and via scheduled projections on Sunday.

Maquilapolis created by **Sergio de la Torre** and **Vicky Funari** with a group of female activists in **Tijuana**. The collaborative documentary project takes a considered look at the ramifications of Mexico's International Monetary Fund (IMF) debt and the boom of factories since the creation of North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA).

Straight Outta Hunters Point by **Kevin Epps**. In this documentary, Epps examines the daily drama of gang-related rap wars that plague Hunters Point as the community fights for social and economic survival.

The School of Panamerican Unrest as documented by **Pablo Helguera**. The documentary follows the mobile schoolhouse as it traveled from Anchorage, Alaska to the southern tip of Argentina in 2006, generating connections between different regions of the Americas.
